

Steps in the Membership Process (Member's Handbook p 24-25)

For an Unknown Prospective Member

If you are approached by a women who you do not know, you can either invite them to attend an open functions (refer to Invitation for Guests below) such as Birthing Kit Assembly Day and/or ask them to complete an *Expression of Interest Form*.

For a Known Prospective Member follow the following steps:

- 1. nominate prospective member (PM) who meets the criteria for membership
- 2. member (the nominator) fills in *Prospective Membership Form* on p 25 and returns it to the Membership Committee (MC)
- 3. MC seeks board and general member's approval allowing 2-3 weeks
- 4. Approved (PM) are usually informally invited to functions such as Coffee Club and their level of interest gauged
- 5. MC sends a letter to join and nominating member or MC follow up within 2 weeks
- 6. PM fills in a **New Member Application Form** and pays membership fee
- 7. New member is inducted into the club and completes a *Member Profile*.
